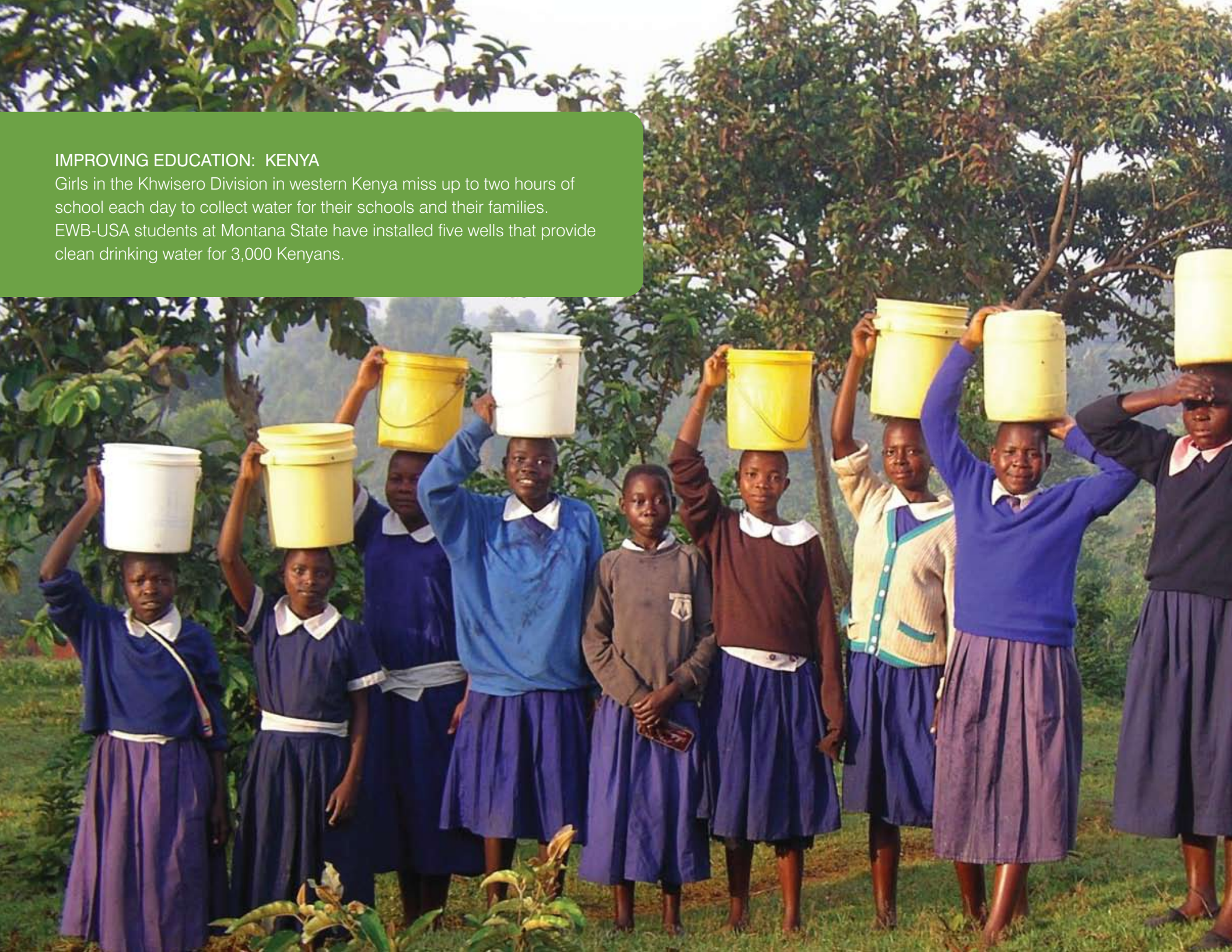

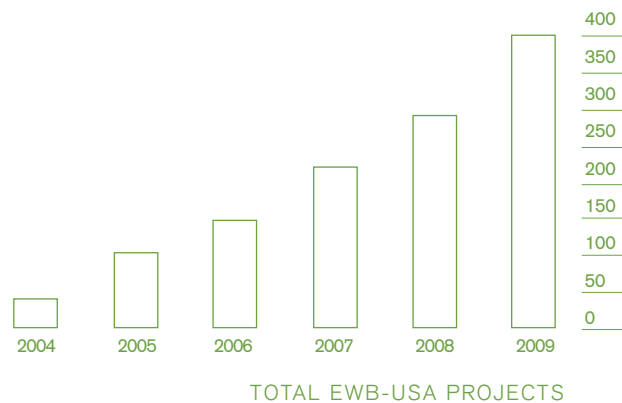
IMPROVING EDUCATION: KENYA

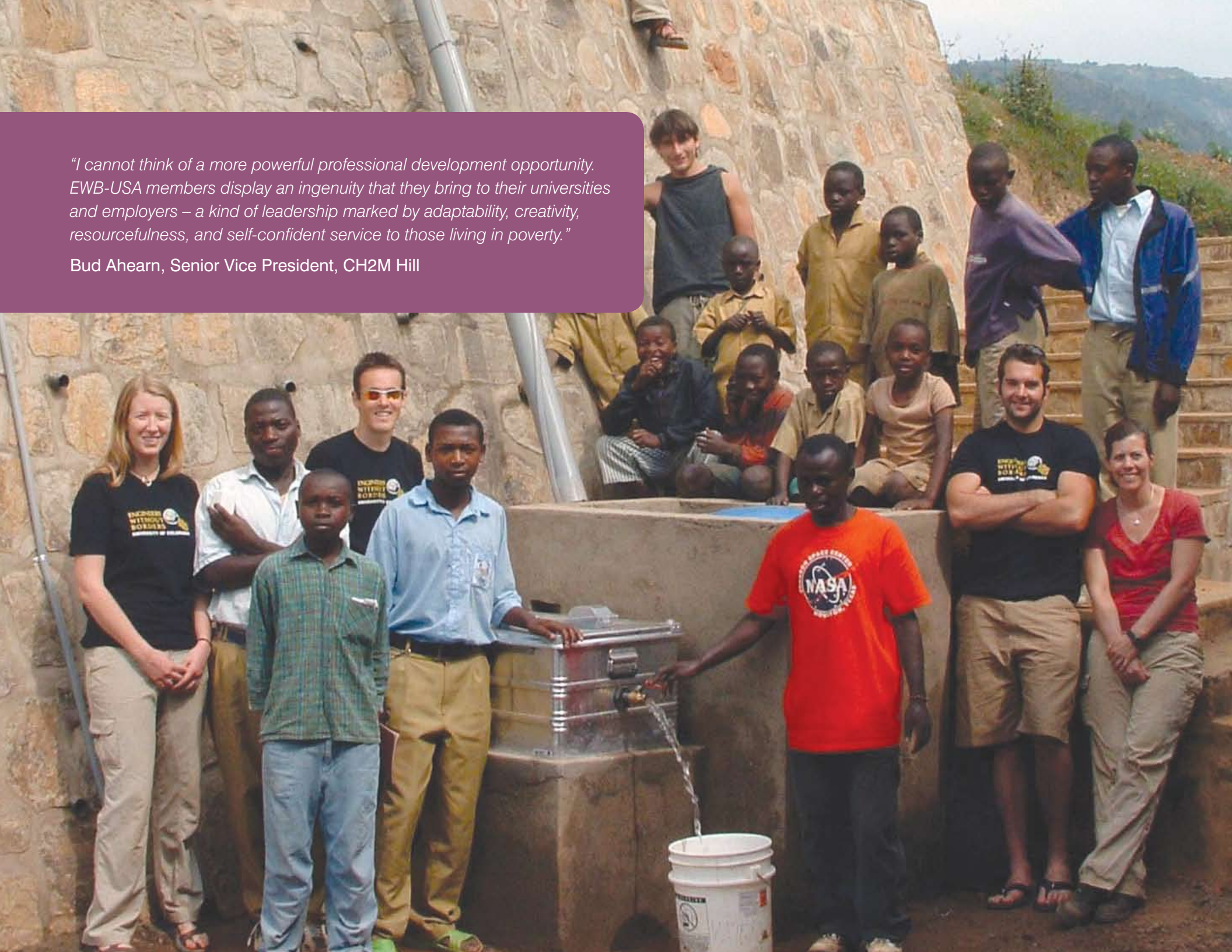
